

Regulations

1. A competitor must be a member of a club affiliated to the East of England Area of NAFAS.
2. A Novice is defined as a person who has not won a First Prize at a NAFAS Area or National Show,
3. A Junior is defined as a member of an East of England Junior Flower Club or a child or grandchild of an eligible competitor.
4. All entries are classed as exhibits and judged in accordance with **NAFAS Competitions Manual 4th Edition 2023** available from nafas.org.uk.
5. Except for Classes 1 and 8 which are judged all round and class 6 judged from front and above, all other classes to be judged from the front.
6. The judges' decisions shall be final.
7. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitor(s) and must be assembled in the marquee with the exception of Classes 6, 8, 9 and 10, which may be submitted already assembled.
8. Classes 1, 6, 8, 9 and 10 **WILL NOT** be included in the Best in Show Award.
9. Aerosol sprays **MUST NOT** be used in the marquee.
10. No artificial plant material may be used unless otherwise stated.
11. All exhibits and exhibitor's property will be at the risk of the exhibitor and the East of England Area of NAFAS accepts NO liability whatsoever for loss or damage sustained by any exhibit or competitor or their property.
12. Class numbers are limited and will be decided on a first-come first-served basis.

Staging

13. The show organisers will decide the position of all exhibits
14. All measurements in the staging instructions are approximate. All exhibits must be staged in the space provided.
15. Competitors are reminded that sufficient space should be left within the containers to allow watering to be carried out by the stewards. The committee reserve the right to remove faded and dying plant material after judging has been completed. If you do not wish for any watering please place your 'No watering' card alongside your exhibitor's card.
16. **No photography** during staging.
17. No more than three exhibits allowed per person.
18. Tea and coffee will be available during staging.

AN EXHIBIT to include a deck chair. Open to all Clubs affiliated to NAFAS.

Two people may stage this exhibit.

Space allowed – width 150 cm x depth 150 cm x height optional.

Staged on the ground – own base optional. To be viewed and judged all round.

CLASS 2 AGE OF ELEGANCE

A PEDESTAL EXHIBIT

Space allowed - width 140 cm x depth 140 cm x height optional.

Staged on the ground against a white marquee lining - own base optional.

Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 3 TAKE FLIGHT

A FOAM FREE EXHIBIT

Floral foam, Agra wool and Fibre floral not to be used

Space allowed – width 70cm x depth 60cm x height 120cm

Staged on open tabling. Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 4 COLOURS OF THE SUNSET

AN EXHIBIT

Space allowed – width 85cm x depth 60cm x height 40cm

Staged on open tabling against white marquee lining. Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 5 PLANTED TO PERFECTION

PLANTS AND FLOWERS EXHIBIT

Space allowed - width 80cm x depth 60cm x height optional.

Staged on open tabling against white marquee lining. Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 6 REFLECTIONS

PETITE EXHIBIT

Space allowed - width 25cm x depth 25cm x height 37cm. Staged on a mirror tile 30cm square - on open tabling. Mirror tile will be supplied.

May be brought ready assembled.

Viewed and judged from front and above.

CLASS 7 FUN AT THE FAIR

NOVICE CLASS

Space allowed - width 65cm x depth 60cm x height 120cm.

Open to exhibitors who have not achieved a 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize at a NAFAS Area or National Show. Staged on open tabling against white marquee lining. Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 8 COASTAL GLEANINGS

CRAFT CLASS - GARLAND

Featuring dried and preserved plant material.

Space allowed - width 30cm x depth 30cm x height 100cm. Loop for hanging should be attached at one end. May be brought ready assembled. To be viewed and judged all round.

CLASS 9 SEALIFE

CRAFT EXHIBIT – PICTURE / PLAQUE

Featuring dried and preserved plant material. May be brought ready assembled.

Open to Juniors aged up to 10

Age to be stated on entry form

Space allowed - width 40cm x depth 10cm x height 30cm.

Canvas board will be supplied to each entrant upon entry application.

Loop for hanging to be attached.

Viewed and judged from the front.

CLASS 10 SEALIFE

CRAFT EXHIBIT – PICTURE / PLAQUE

Featuring dried and preserved plant material. May be brought ready assembled.

Open to Juniors aged 11 to 17

Age to be stated on entry form

Space allowed – width 40cm x depth 10cm x height 30cm.

Canvas board will be supplied to each entrant upon entry application.

Loop for hanging to be attached.

Viewed and judged from the front.

Classes 1 and 2 staged directly on the grass

Classes 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 staged on tabling 75cm high covered in grey material.
